KYS currently provides services for 5400 young people which has a staff of 38 from different modalities. This includes Drs, Nurses, Clinical Psychologist, Counsellors, Social Workers, Youth Workers, Mentors, Young mums programme, Project Youth (LGBTQI+), Financial Capability and Youth Reps.

At KYS Darryl Gardiner provides mentoring services primarily for young males. He also provides supervision and mentoring for KYS staff. Outside of KYS, Darryl provides supervision and training for a range of individuals and groups.

Sue Gardiner works primarily with young mothers and their children providing holistic support including ante-natal and parenting programmes (Triple P/Incredible Years based).
